
# EDITO





# An Interview with Mr. V.K. Shunglu

#### Chairman

### The Delhi Public School Society & D.P.S. R.K. Puram Managing Committee

EB: Sir, What is the one morning ritual you religiously follow?


**Chairman Sir:** Morning tea! I simply love my morning tea.

EB: So what has DPS RKPuram accomplished that is most noteworthy?

Chairman Sir: It represents, in essence, the culture of the DPS family.

#### EB: Sir, how has your worldview changed over the years?

**Chairman Sir:** If I take the last 40 years, 1982 to 2020, there has been a political and economic transformation. Politically many of the societies which were autocratic have fallen by the wayside. Economically, there's been far more concentration of wealth than was there in 1980. So politically you could arguably say that the world has improved, but there are losses economically. If you say that we are looking for the greatest good of the greatest number, there has been some dilution in that recently, there is a book which has been published. You might have heard of the French author, Thomas Piketty and his recent foray 'Brief History of Equality' where he discusses how the economic situation has worsened for the majority of the people.



**Chairman Sir:** I really don't wish to be remembered at all. I'm too inconsequential to be remembered.







#### EB: Sir, what is a legacy that you would want us to follow?

Chairman Sir: I have supported the evolving legacy of the DPS family. It is the only society which has several unique features. So if you look at the balance sheet of any other non-profit society, you would find that there are people who had subscribed to the initial constitution of the society. What is unique about the DPS Society balance sheet is that there are no such contributors. So financially there is no owner. Politically also there are no owners. So if you were to look at this society in 1970 when R. K. Puram started, not a single member at present was a member of the DPS society at that time. So it has been evolving and there is no owner, either political or economic. That is a unique feature that has led to its growth as an institution.

EB: Sir, if you could spend one day in someone else's shoes, who would it be and why?

Chairman Sir: Oh, I have a very peculiar shoe size (laughs) so I don't fit into anybody's shoes!

EB: What is the one thing that you would add to your Wikipedia page that not many people know of?

Chairman Sir: That I'm good at answering questions.

**EB:** Sir, on looking back, what is a life experience that shaped the person you are today? Chairman Sir: You can't define a single moment in time when the monkey became a man, right? That's what Darwin talks about. What is the missing link? Similarly in our personal evolution, we don't know that. There's this argument that what you are today, you always were. So if Macbeth was evil, he was never good. When he went on a killing spree, some people argue he was always like that. The other side of the argument is that people change over the years: they evolve. And frankly speaking, most of the students who were in school with me and who are my age now don't recognise me. They didn't know the person I am today.







EB: Thank you so much, sir. Did you have a role model when you were younger? Who was it? Chairman Sir: My father was my role model. He was a very learned man and he started his life by teaching English at Delhi University.

#### EB: So in your opinion, what role does the youth play in shaping the future of a country?

**Chairman Sir:** Sixteen to twenty years are the formative years for the youth. Einstein, I think, when he published the special theory of relativity, was not more than 23 or 24 years of age. Same with Isaac Newton. Such extraordinary geniuses! Youth is the foundation for the growth of such geniuses!

**EB:** Thank you, Sir. So what is the kindest deed someone has done for you that has left a lasting impression?

**Chairman Sir:** No single deed would trump every other deed. Most people around me are very kind. I think one of the secrets of doing well is the unstated kindness of people with whom I'm associated.

## EB: Thank you. Can you please tell us about a project you enjoyed working on and what was one takeaway from it?

Chairman Sir: Recently one of the projects which I enjoyed very much was the one when the lockdown was declared in March 2020. What struck me was what will happen to the climate because all the cars are off. So what will it do to pollution? And so, from April 2020 and up to October, November 2020, I used my phone and took down readings of the pollution level. What was the wind direction? What was the temperature? What was the rainfall and so on? And I did it on my own from April, as I said, to October. And then earlier RK Puram had done a study on this, they had used the metereological data. So this thing was given to them and they updated their work, based on this data. And what is striking me again is that if you go back to, say, even 2020, and you pick up five or ten days in July and you compare, let's say air pollution after two years, it's much less these days. You are staying somewhere around 100-105, not going beyond 130. But two years back, it was not as good as that.







EB: Sir, according to you, what would an ideal world look like?

**Chairman Sir:** You would probably look back on a single day in school when you were totally bored. So that would be the ideal day (laughs).

## EB: Sir, What is one school tradition from your childhood that you would like to bring back?

**Chairman Sir:** In our school, we had a very unique tradition. There was a semicircular race platform, a bit like a pavilion, where you had the playing field. The school used to assemble on the pavilion steps. One of the senior masters would come and sit on the platform facing the boys. Once in a while he narrated a story. If it was a music teacher, he played something on the violin, This had to be done exactly as the sun went down. As dusk fell, we were required to observe about five to seven minutes of silence, irrespective of what went on in our minds. That had a calming effect after a hectic day because in a boarding school, you would start at six in the morning with physical training, and you ended at six in the evening with games. After a bath, you assembled in the pavilion. It would be great to have that back in present schools.

## EB: Sir, what is the one thing that you would say has been constant in DPS RKP even after 50 years?

**Chairman Sir:** R. K. Puram started evolving a culture of its own when it branched out from Mathura Road. Mr. Lugani who set up RKP was the Vice Principal at Mathura Road. He was a protege of Mr. Deen Dayal, who was the Principal at Mathura Road. The student community at R. K. Puram was drawn from a cohesive parent community, and I think that still remains the case.

EB: Sir, as DPS RK Puram turns 50 this year, what is your message for the students? Chairman Sir: The message, as I see it, is for RK Puram to not lose its evolutionary impulse and its pride in history. We also have to think about what we can become.

# An Interview with Ms. Padma Srinivasan

## Principal

## The Delhi Public School Society & D.P.S. R.K. Puram Managing Committee

EB: When did you decide that you wanted to become a teacher?

**Principal ma'am:** As soon as I finished college though the desire was always there.

EB: Ma'am, if you could go back in time to visit any historical period, what time would you go back to and what would you do there?

**Principal ma'am:** Every historical period has its own glamour and distinct lifestyle. But one really wonders, having lived in the present day, whether one will be able to cope up with living in any other historical period. We are spoiled for many things. In hindsight, I don't think one would prefer to live in any other historical period. We have come too far, become too free, too technology-dependent, too reliant on the comforts of modern life, which we didn't have in the past. We have learnt to control the environment to a large extent, for good or bad. We also have considerable control over our lives. That's why I think the time period that we are living in is the best.

#### EB: Ma'am, what are your views on interdisciplinary learning?

**Principal ma'am:** I think interdisciplinary learning is a concept that is emerging in India now. Our school also subscribes to it as far as possible within the given constraints. It is an excellent idea. I seriously feel that interdisciplinary learning must be there. Take carbon dating for example: When you analyse a fossil, you are required to have knowledge of chemistry, biology and history to make sense of your findings. History is well connected with other disciplines, especially archaeology and anthropology.







#### EB: Ma'am, what is that special moment in your life that you would like to relive?

**Principal ma'am:** The 50th year celebrations! Till the time it was going on, we all wanted it to finish fast as there was so much stress because so many activities were involved in it. But the moment it was over, everyone wanted to relive that moment.

#### EB: Ma'am, which historical period or event do you enjoy teaching the most and why?

**Principal ma'am:** I like teaching my subject in all its aspects. So it's not any one particular period of history that interests me. I have specialised in modern India and the history of China, Japan, and bits and pieces of Europe. But I feel that every time period has its own charm. Every time period is extremely interesting and relevant at some stage or the other. Most of the controversies of the present days seem to be rooted in the past. So, every time period has its own charm.

## EB: Ma'am, what is the one major challenge that you managed to overcome as a principal and in retrospect learned a lot from?

**Principal ma'am:** Every day is a learning experience. Everything that we do here, every case is a new case and every human being has different kinds of issues and problems. Dealing with it is a learning experience. Every day we try to improve the way that we function by learning from everything which is happening on a day to day basis. Every interaction with a child or a teacher or a parent is a learning experience.

#### EB: Ma'am, what is your fondest memory as a faculty member at DPS RKP

**Principal Ma'am:** Interaction with all children is interesting. When you go to the class and the children are expected to meet you, and interact in something, I looked forward.



#### EB: ma'am, what is the one thing you wish people would remember you for?

**Principal Ma'am:** For making a subject such as history very interesting. When you meet a lot of people who teach the same subject, I find that they do not make the subject interesting. Yes, it needs a lot of reading, a lot of understanding. So the way you teach or the way you make them understand becomes totally different. It becomes an experience rather than only concentrating on rote learning for which this subject is generally known.

**EB**: Ma'am, if you could change one thing in how history is taught or studied, what would it be? **Principal Ma'am**: I seriously feel that reading texts and making the children read the texts on their own is very important. Once you do that, class based discussions on what happened then and comparing it to the present - what is happening around you - the comparative study of the events is very important. Constant interaction between past and the present makes a person understand history as a subject much better.

## EB: Thank you ma'am. Ma'am what are your views on India moving beyond cricket vis a via sports achievemen?

**Principal Ma'am:** Cricket is an obsession with people. It has a tremendous snob value. Other team events and other individual sports need to be encouraged. Of course, now we are winning more and more medals in all the world games, including our own homegrown celebrities. So it's a welcome change and I hope everybody will value other sports as well.

## EB: Ma'am, how do you think the learning's from ancient mythogical texts are relevant for students today?

**Principal Ma'am:** The mythologies, be it Indian or Western mythologies, have some kind of a social or a moral message, which of course might have been relevant to that particular time period. But when you look at it closely then many of these things are relevant today as well. When you talk about mythologies, there are many important takeaways from them. You understand the social and cultural conditions that existed at that time from the mythologies.







**EB:** Thank you ma'am. Ma'am on the occasion of the 50th year anniversary, what is your vision for the next 50 years? **Principal Ma'am:** First we have to keep in tune with the Generation Y and Z. The education and the school systems have to keep pace with these generations. Generation Y and Z seem to consider technology more important than humans but we have to keep human interaction in the field of education intact. It has to be balanced. Technology has to be there with the value of human intervention, particularly in the field of education because education is nurturing of a child to grow with the right values, ethics, morals, habits and behaviour. We have to strike a balance in being conservative and progressive.

#### EB: Ma'am, what is the best compliment you've ever received?

**Principal Ma'am:** Recently the script of my speech was misplaced during the 50th year celebrations. On the first day there was no light on the podium to help me read. So I rendered my speech without the help of the script. I was well prepared on the second day. I switched on the torch in my phone, but the script was missing! So again, I had to resort to an impromptu speech! As I walked down feeling relaxed, Mrs. Shayama Chona, the former Principal of Delhi Public School RK Puram told me, 'A long speech, but extempore! Very nice.' This came as a wonderful compliment.
